Service Coordinator's Corner: Rebecca Ogrodowski

This month's article is about resources. I have found many new services and agencies, along with some familiar ones. I print an updated list and post it on the corkboard by the SC office from time to time.

2-1-1 is the be all for referrals. They can provide information over the phone, in print, and on the internet. Almost anything you want to know about can be found there. I have promotional material in the office.

Senior Services' *Best of Care* book is another great source for local providers. They update their listings regularly. The book is free. If you would like a copy, let me know.

If you are looking for help with getting food, Loaves and Fishes can enroll you a program that allows people to collect free groceries at a nearby church. They also have communal meal sites (requiring a phone call to arrange the details).

MMAP (Michigan Medicare Medicaid Assistance Program) is a free, state program for people with questions about those two insurers. MMAP has experience with MI Health Link and the details about how it works. You can call them at 1.800.803.7174. Their office is at Senior Services.

I have been researching agencies that could help with paying for hearing aids. Medicare will cover the cost of office services, but not the actual devices. I found the Better Hearing Institute, which prints a guide to finding financial assistance. The guide has information about many agencies that could help you to solve this problem.

There are many, many more possibilities out there.

I am working with Walgreens to have a flu shot clinic at the end of September or early October. Nothing definite is available yet.
