Service Coordinator Report

It has come to my attention that not everyone understands exactly what a Service Coordinator does. There may be some confusion because of my early days with Hillside. Since there had never been an SC here before, there was no structure in place to step into so I spent quite a bit of time planning and attending activities so that residents could get to know me and learn more about what I could offer. Unfortunately, this was translated as "activities director". This is actually something that is discouraged unless it is the monthly educational offerings that I arrange. What I WILL do for any resident who requests assistance is help locate resources and provide guidance to navigate the forms and phone calls that other agencies require. This year some of the services I provided are: getting new hearing aids, finding funding sources for dental work, lobbying for phone discounts, and getting money returned from a business that had some questionable practices. Also, while I do post office hours and make every attempt to be here, a fair amount of what I do involves meetings and other contacts with people who are not residents here. As such, I am sometimes working but not in my office. And because of privacy issues, not everything can comfortably be done in my basement space, which as you know, is very open and not very private. I am fine with drop-ins and will always see you if I am free but it is possible and preferable to make an appointment. After our move takes place, I will be splitting my time between here and Birchwood (as well as dropping in on those residents in the condos and cottages). Generally speaking, I plan to be at D Building on Tuesdays and Birchwood on Thursdays but can adjust my schedule to accommodate appointments at other times.

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September is National Healthy Aging Month. In the word search below there are 20 things you can do to stay healthy as you age. See if you can find all 20!


