It's Your Life. Live It Well.

October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Although breast cancer is the second leading cause of death among women, because of early detection and treatment an increasing number of women diagnosed with breast cancer are beating the disease. According to the American Cancer Society (ACS), when breast cancer is detected early and is in the localized stage, the 5 year relative survival rate is 100%. To detect breast cancer early, the ACS recommends that beginning at age 40 women have both an annual clinical breast exam (CBE) performed by their health care provider and an annual mammogram for as long as they remain healthy. It is important to remember that it is health status, not age that should determine whether or not to continue with regular mammograms. As long as you remain healthy and don't have a serious, chronic health condition you should continue getting an annual mammogram. And though mammograms aren't fool proof, they are an important tool in detecting breast cancer early. Service Coordinator's Corner: Rebecca Ogrodowski

The Michigan Department of Community Health is hosting a public forum (from 10a – 12p on October 20) on the subject of MI Health Link. If you have this coverage and would like to participate, I will be joining by phone and you are welcome to keep me company.

The Medicare policy requiring that a person be admitted to a hospital for three days before Medicare will reimburse the provider at the highest possible rate is being considered in Congress. It appears to have strong support in both houses for allowing all time spent in the hospital to be counted. Senator Stabenow, Senator Levin, and Representative Hoadley need to know how you feel about this issue.

Advocacy remains important. According to Leading Age Michigan, the budget for Medicare's home health payments could be cut by \$350 million dollars in 2016. That would mean major changes to services for people using Medicare to pay for this benefit. Senior housing (including the PRAC 202 program, which funds Sage Grove) is also dealing with cuts. In June, the United States House of Representatives passed H.R. 2577, which leaves the Section 202 program \$44 million short of the money needed to operate. The Senate passed a funding bill that is \$16 million less than needed. The elected officials mentioned above should also be aware of your reactions.
