NOTES FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR

On February 2<sup>nd</sup>, Punxsutawney Phil predicted six more weeks of winter. We certainly hope his predictions are correct. The sudden and stark changes in the weather have made it difficult for contractors and staff to keep up. Every effort has been made to keep the sidewalks and lots as safe as possible. However, we do apologize for any inconvenience you may have experienced.

March 13<sup>th</sup> is the beginning of Daylight Savings Time. Remember to "spring" forward by setting your clocks one hour ahead.

Pet owners, please read and abide by the Pet Policy Lease Addendum. When outside of your apartment, pets must be on a leash and accompanied by the resident. You must immediately pick up after and dispose of your dog's waste. Failure to do so will result in a lease violation, possible removal of the pet from the campus and/or eviction of the tenant.

For Income Qualified (Tax Credit) residents, you are required to recertify your eligibility each year before your anniversary date. Notification is sent 60-90 days from your anniversary date to allow time for third-party verification. If you are unsure of your recertification anniversary date, please contact the office.

The One Call phone system is the means by which we disseminate information to all residents. Calls are generally sent out after business hours and on weekends. If you are unable to get to the phone, a message will be left on your answering machine. We would appreciate you listening to the message and not calling the office to ask the nature of the call.

Scam artists are relentless when it comes to trying to steal personal information and life savings. They are also nimble to take advantage of any new opportunities that come their way. Their latest scam involves COVID relief issues. In fact, you may have already received robocalls, text messages or emails offering COVID-19 test kits in exchange for your personal or medical information. Do not give out your Medicare Number for COVID-19 test kits! Hang up immediately!

Make sure to purchase FDA-approved COVID-19 test kits from legitimate providers. Over-the-counter or at-home tests are available for sale at many reputable and trustworthy retailers and pharmacies. Remember that each household in America can receive four free COVID-19 at-home tests shipped directly to their home at no cost. Visit <u>COVIDtests.gov</u> to order tests or learn more about testing.
