Power Outages

Between 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. the Security guard can get you in. During the day, staff will welcome you. But between 5:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. neither of those would work. So Council members living in the Villa have volunteered to spend an hour in the lobby to let you in if you need. Call your representative, and they will contact the appropriate member. This won't work on weekends. Administration is working on the issue.



