SPIRITUAL LIFE AT THE VILLAGE OF REDFORD

As a faith-based community, the Village of Redford offers a variety of events and programs to meet the spiritual needs of all our residents. Our Sunday morning non-denominational worship service is at 10:30 a.m. every Sunday in the Elizabeth C. Patterson Chapel. Holy Communion is celebrated the first Sunday of each month and for special religious occasions. Unlike other churches, we never pass the offering plate. The Chapel is a place of peace for you. All residents, families and caregivers are welcome. Please consider attending. Additionally, Christian Family Ministries conducts their congregational worship in the Chapel at noon on Sundays. They welcome residents and families to attend their services also.

<u>Bible studies and spiritual discussion groups</u> meet at various times and places around the community. Mondays at 10:00 a.m. in the Villa Dining Room (except the second Monday of the month), Mondays at 2:00 p.m. in the Garfield House, Tuesdays at 1:30 p.m. in the Chapel, Tuesdays at 3:00 p.m. in the Fireplace Room, Wednesdays in the Redford House at 11:45 a.m. A group meets in Sylvan Terrace monthly, second Monday at 10:00 a.m., hosted by different residents on a rotating basis. The topics are chosen by the residents and reflect the joys, the challenges and the questions of life. A special worship service is conducted in Heritage Court each Sunday at 12:15 p.m.

<u>Rosary and Communion</u> are held every Tuesday at 9:30 a.m. in the Chapel. Volunteers from various Catholic parishes provide this valuable service for our residents. Fr. Socorro Fernandes from Our Lady of Loretto conducts <u>Mass</u> the third Saturday of each month. Anointing Masses are conducted twice a year.

<u>Ward Presbyterian Church</u> visits on the second Monday of the month, with a sing-along and devotions. <u>Other churches</u>, <u>religious organizations and individuals</u> visit with special programs throughout the year. Please check the monthly calendars for all spiritual life activities and programs.

DEAR Village of Redford INDEPENDENT RESIDENTS:

Since Julie is no longer with us, Janet Frederick has picked up many of Julie's duties. We would love to continue offering transportation to you for doctor appointments; however, Janet cannot be "on-call" for these appointments. Therefore, we will try to schedule Janet so she can drive the bus one day every two weeks. The appointments will have to be set up on the day of the week she decides upon. It may be a Monday one week, and then a Tuesday another week. She will put together a schedule and it will be mailed to you.

You will have to make sure your doctor is aware of the days that transportation is available to you and schedule your appointments accordingly.

The hours will be 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. Please do not make your appointments for 8:00 a.m. or for 3:00 p.m.; you will need to give Janet at least 30 minutes to get you to your appointment, so no earlier than 8:30 a.m. and then back to the Village by 3:00 p.m.; so no later than 1:45 p.m. If you have any questions or concerns please contact either Janet Frederick at 541-6047 or Karl Schillinger at 533-4783.

Fire Safety

May was one of our two fire drill months for independent living. By now you should have participated in a fire drill at your Village. Why should you participate in these drills? You should participate in these drills because it just might save your life. We do drills so that in the event there is a real fire, you will know how to react. Last year, we had a fire in one of our units that completely burnt the unit down. It pays to know what to do when the alarm goes off.

During a fire drill, staff is looking for barriers to evacuating the building in a fast safe manner. Do some residents need assistance? Can all the residents hear the actual alarm ringing? Do residents know where to go when the alarm does go off? Can the building be evacuated quickly? Can we improve the time? Each time a drill is completed; staff de-briefs and looks for ways to improve.

If you cannot hear your fire alarm or do not know what to do in the event the alarm goes off, please contact your administrator. We can help. Please do your part and make yourself available to participate on the day of the drill.

Remember, all our campuses are non-smoking. The fire last year was caused by a cigarette burning on a couch. Bar-b-que grills are not allowed on balconies or patios that are near the building. Never use an open flame, such as a candle in your apartment. Use a timer to remind you that you have placed something on the stove. All these tips, plus participating in fire drills, will go a long way to keep you and fellow residents safe.



Listening to the Classics

I

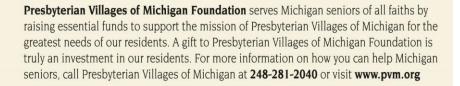
