

Joyce's son, Charles is an airplane Mechanic with 2 sons from his first marriage, then married a woman with 3 boys, they had another boy together, giving her 6 grandsons. Carl, the youngest is a cook at Oakland University and has never married.

Joyce moved to the Village of Oakland Woods 4 years ago. She joined the Choir, the Garden Club, and is treasurer on Resident Council. She is also involved in the Village Victory Cup and has won 5 gold and 3 silver medals since participating.
