BEAT THE HEAT

As I write this the temperature is expected to reach 100 degrees today. This is just the beginning since a hot summer is on the horizon. Many thanks to the Detroit Housing Commission for sharing many of the following tips:

COOL YOUR BODY – Wet clothing to help bring down body temperature. Use water-soaked cloths or cooling packs on neck/wrists. Sit in or put legs in cool (not cold) bath.

HYDRATE – Drink water/cool liquids. Eat fresh fruit & salads. Drink before you feel thirsty.

REDUCE INDOOR HEAT – During the daytime cool living and working areas by closing windows and using window coverings, air conditioner and misters.

ASK YOUR DOCTOR – If taking medications, ask your doctor's office regarding special precautions. Also check out the recommended water intake. Some medical conditions may increase vulnerability during hot weather.

AVOID/LIMIT ALCOHOL & CAFFEINE – These can increase dehydration.

AVOID SUN EXPOSURE – Wear a wide-brimmed, breathable hat or use an umbrella. Avoid/limit strenuous activities during the hottest part of the day. Find shade if you must be outside; and be sure to use sunscreen. However, it is best to avoid/limit doing so all together. Perhaps a friend or family member who is less vulnerable can run errands and do shopping for you.

PROTECT YOUR PETS – Provide shade and cool drinking water and baths. Never leave pets unattended in cars or direct sunlight. They probably want to be inside as well. Plan any outdoor activities during cooler times. Asphalt may be too hot for paws.

CHECK ON OTHERS – Check in on family members and friends. Share these tips with them as well.

VOTE ON AUGUST 2, 2022

On August 2nd, 2022, Redford Township District Library will ask residents to approve 2 mills to fund the library for a period of 20 years. This millage is not a tax increase. Maintenance Musings Reminders

- No food or drinks are allowed in the common area, ONLY in the dining room.
- Do not place food garbage in outside large dumpster outside of shipping and receiving, please break down card board boxes also. If bags are too large to fit into trash chute please bring down to shipping and receiving area. Non-food trash can be taken outside ex. Small tables/chairs etc.
- <u>PET OWNERS</u> you must <u>secure</u> your pet for the safety our maintenance staff.
- Work orders will be addressed as soon as possible depending on severity. CALL THE OFFICE FOR ALL WORK ORDERS, please state if ok to enter if not at home. If you're not available they'll return as soon as they can which may not be the same day.
- Be conscious when cooking, if you set your smoke alarm off it must be reset, please be patient, maintenance is required to stop what they're doing and respond immediately. Fire pits, etc. are <u>prohibited</u> and should not be placed on your balconies/porches. If the fire department responds there could be a charge. Keep in mind the alarm is designed to send an alert regardless of how little the smoke or steam may be.
- Do not block cold air return (the vent on the floor near the patio door).
- When turning on your a/c select the auto option.
- Refrain from storing non-patio on items on porches.

Please use 30 gallon tall kitchen garbage bags for your trash. Sticks, leaves, dirt etc. should be placed in lawn bags.
