Lemon Caper Chicken



- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1 teaspoon lemon pepper
- 5 tablespoons allpurpose flour
- 3 chicken cutlets
- Zest and juice of 1 lemon
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 cup chicken broth
- 2 tablespoons capers
- 3 finely minced cloves garlic
- 1 splash half-and-half (optional)
- Parsley, for garnish (optional)

Directions

- **1.** On a flat dish, combine kosher salt, pepper, lemon pepper and 2 tbsp of the flour. Coat chicken cutlets in flour mixture and place on a plate. Sprinkle half of the lemon zest over cutlets.
- **2.** Heat oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Brown chicken until cooked through, about 7 minutes, turning once. Transfer to a fresh plate.
- **3.** In a bowl, whisk lemon juice, chicken broth, capers, garlic and remaining zest until smooth. Pour into skillet with drippings and whisk until combined. Add half-and-half, if desired. Return chicken to pan and heat through, 2 minutes. To serve, spoon sauce over cutlets and garnish with parsley, if desired.



TIPS FOR YOU AND YOUR FAMILY - PART 4

During one of the times that my mother was in a nursing home for rehab, the facility had a vendor fair for representatives to bring their information about assisted living, Medicaid, funeral home arrangements, Elder Law, etc.

A Will is a very important document and is probably one of the most undervalued of any necessary documents to have. My mother had a very old and outdated Will, and I kept putting off having one made. I didn't know about Elder Law so I approached the lawyer to get information. He told me that Elder Law is specific to the needs of older persons.

- ** It was interesting to learn that:
 - (1) a lawyer who draws up a Will keeps a file copy but is not responsible to keep track of it;
- (2) "for safety's sake", it is recommended that a Will be kept by the Probate Court of that person's county;
 - (3) if the person moves to another county, city or state, the Will should be removed from the current court in order to be stored with the Probate Court at the new location.
- ** Note: Information was verified on May 3, 2018 with an Elder Law manager. By the way, there is a one-time \$25 fee for storage.

After telling my mother about my talk with the lawyer, she decided to make a new will and I decided it was time for me to get one. When both Wills were drawn up, I made a copy of them before taking the originals downtown to the Wayne County Probate Court.

STOMP OUT ELDER ABUSE!

June 15th was World Elder Abuse Awareness Day. Elder Abuse and exploitation is a rapidly growing problem in America and will continue to increase with the aging of our population. Lance Robertson of the Administration For Community Living, formerly the Administration on Aging at the federal level, released information on how to join the fight for elder justice. He stated that we need to:

BREAK DOWN ISOLATION

Elders without strong social networks are at greater risk. Stay in touch with older adults in your community. Support community efforts to fight isolation. Volunteer to deliver meals or act as a long-term care ombudsman who works to report abuse, neglect and exploitation.

LEARN TO SPOT RED FLAGS

There are a number of "red flags": Isolation, especially by a caregiver; unpaid bills or utilities that have been turned off; unusual or quick changes in a will or other financial documents; missing medications; bruises or welts.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Elder abuse is more difficult to recognize than child abuse since children attend school. Thus, it is important that fellow citizens observe very carefully for any of the red flags mentioned. Bank tellers, nurses and physicians, senior services providers, hair stylists and others with front line access to seniors can make a difference. Report any red flags to the proper authorities. The statewide hotline in Michigan is (855) 444-3911. Let's look out for others who may not be able to protect themselves from harm.

This Month at the Movies...



Kidnap: A typical afternoon in the park turns into a nightmare for single mother Karla Dyson when kidnappers snatch her young son Frankie. With no cellphone and no time to wait for police, Dyson jumps into her car to follow the vehicle that holds Frankie. As the pursuit turns into a frantic, high-speed chase, Karla must risk everything and push herself to the limit to save her beloved child.

3 Billboards Outside Ebbing, Missouri: Mildred Hayes, a hard-nosed mother is seeking justice for her murdered daughter. With no arrests after seven months, Mildred puts up three roadside signs to goad Ebbing police chief into action. But the law - and especially Sam Rockwell's hotheaded deputy - don't take kindly to the provocation. And the townsfolk are on their side. But Mildred doesn't care about ruffling a few feathers. In fact, she's happy to pluck the whole bird.

Marshall: Young Thurgood Marshall faces one of his greatest challenges while working as a lawyer for the NAACP. Marshall travels to conservative Connecticut when wealthy socialite Eleanor Strubing accuses black chauffeur Joseph Spell of sexual assault and attempted murder. He soon teams up with Sam Friedman, a local Jewish lawyer who's never handled a criminal case. Together, the two men build a defense while contending with racist and anti-Semitic views from those who deem Spell to be guilty.

Black Panther: After the death of his father, T'Challa returns home to the African nation of Wakanda to take his rightful place as king. When a powerful enemy suddenly reappears, T'Challa's mettle as king -- and as Black Panther -- gets tested when he's drawn into a conflict that puts the fate of Wakanda and the entire world at risk. Faced with treachery and danger, the young king must rally his allies and release the full power of Black Panther to defeat his foes and secure the safety of his people.
