Do <u>NOT</u> give out ANY personal information to anybody you do not know Ask the solicitor for a business card or a badge number

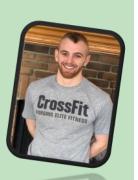
Conduct research on that company ONLY after being provided with information
