SUMMARY OF EXECUTIVE ORDERS

EO-123 June 15 – Enhanced protections for residents and staff of long-term care facilities (**all levels except IL**)

- Long Term Care facilities – nursing home, HFA, AFC, AL, (MC)
- Continues through July 12, 2020
- Cancel all communal dining
- Cancel all internal and external group activities
- Notify employees of changes in CDC recommendations
- Notify staff within 12 hrs of presence of COVID-19 affected resident (positive or symptoms)

EO-136 – June 26 - Restrictions on entry into facilities (**all levels including IL**) (rescinds 108)

- Residential care facilities – Nursing homes, HFA, AFC, AL, Independent living facilities
- Continues through July 24, 2020
- Prohibit from entering into facility any visitor not necessary for:
 - o Medical care
 - o Support of activities of daily living
 - o Exercise of power of attorney or court appointed guardianship for individual in facility's care
 - o Visiting someone in serious or critical condition or hospice care
 - o Visiting under exigent circumstances or performing official governmental functions
- Deny entry to Necessary visitors who do not meet evaluation criteria
 - o Symptoms of respiratory infection – fever, cough or shortness of breath
 - o Contact in last 14 days with someone confirmed diagnosis of COVID-19
 - o Other criteria specified by the Director of DHHS
- Staff/visitor must wear covering over nose and mouth when indoors or within 6 ft of another person
- Promote visitation by phone and other electronic communication

MDHHS – June 30 Director Robert Gordon executed Emergency Order re exceptions to temporary restriction on entry into residential care facilities elaborated on visitors to assist with ADL's and residents needing hospice care.

EO-110 – June 1- Temporary restrictions on certain events gatherings and businesses (**all locations**)

- Moves state to Stage 4 no longer need to stay home
- Work capable of being performed remotely must be performed remotely
- **EO-136 continues to prohibit unnecessary visitors in buildings**
- Restaurants, bars, retailers, libraries, museums can open
- Indoor social gatherings allowed 10 people or less.
- Outdoor social gathering allowed 100 people or less

- Individuals who leave their home must
 - o Remain 6 ft from others not in your residence
 - o Wear a face covering over nose and mouth unless unable medically
- The following are not open
 - o Indoor theater
 - o Indoor fitness centers
 - o Personal care service – hair/nail/tanning/massage/tattoo
 - o Casinos (although tribal opened) and bingo halls
 - o Amusement park
 - o Arcades
 - o Dance/skate/tampoline

EO – 115 – June 5- Temporary restriction on certain events, gatherings and business

- Rescinded 12c of EO 110 - Personal care service – hair/nail/tanning/massage/tattoo allowed state wide (**all locations**)
- **EO- 108 continues to prohibit unnecessary visitors in buildings**
- **Regions 6 & 8** (Lynn Street, Hillside, Perry Farm) no longer subject to EO 110 however
 - o Work that can be performed remotely should be
 - o Businesses follow EO 114
 - o Individuals who leave their home must
 - Remain 6 ft from others not in your residence
 - Wear a face covering over nose and mouth in enclosed public space unless unable medically
 - o Indoor social gatherings allowed 50 people or less
 - o Outdoor social gathering allowed 250 people or less
 - o Inside entertainment venues (theater, arcade, bowling, sports) open with restrictions

EO – 114 –June 5 - Safeguards for workers – see worker safety sheet

- Sections 1, 14-17 apply to all areas.
- Section 7 adds info for offices.
- Section 10 for in home services, cleanser, repair persons and painters.
- Section 11 is for barbering and cosmetology, hair salons.
- Section 13 if for fitness centers, recreation centers.
